- 4. Agree not to sell, reproduce, adapt or distribute any program materials without prior written permission from the Pilots & Program Development Department of the National Council.
- 5. If the pilot is terminated for any reason, agree to discontinue the Lion program or any similar program for kindergarten-age youth

To ensure the success of the Lion Pilot program, the Council will conduct periodic training sessions. In addition, to understand the impact and effect of the Lion Pilot program, the Council will do periodic activity assessments and satisfaction surveys.

- Participates as needed in the unit's School Night with all new Lions and their parents
- Assists the Lion Guides in hosting the first orientation meeting for their dens
- Serves as a coach and mentor for Lion Guides
